**Exhibits to be staged either:** - Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October: 5:30pm – 7pm  
Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October: 8am – 10am

All work to be that of the exhibitor

All work to be original – not copied

Entries to be current work of the exhibitor and not previously entered in the Naracoorte P&A Society Show

Work only to be judged - not the frame

Exhibits must be collected between 4pm and 5pm on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> October

Exhibitor tickets to be attached to items before handing to stewards

#### **SPECIFIC REGULATIONS**

An exhibitor may represent only one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.

An article having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final; the winning article will then compete at the next Royal Melbourne Show.

An article having won a State Final is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.

Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.

If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final levels, the second placegetter is eligible to compete.

A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year.

Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.

All work to have been completed within the last twelve (12) months.

**All VAS Ltd entries must be on official VAS Ltd entry form**

#### **Open Handicraft Section – VAS classes**

1. Tote/carry bag no larger than 50 cm on any one side. Handle/s to be made of fabric. Minimum embellishments allowed. Must be lined. Sewn by machine. May be hand finished. Knitted/Crocheted items not acceptable.
2. Hand knitted jumper or cardigan made from Pure Wool/Wool Blend of any ply. Each garment must have attached label from wool used or label or receipt from Woollen Mill. – VAS Ltd
3. A piece of patchwork, not more than 1 metre on any one side, machine pieced and machine quilted, minimal embellishments (small amount only, not to overpower patchwork) – VAS Ltd
4. An article of hand embroidery, any type, excluding cross stitch – VAS Ltd
5. An article of crochet no larger than 50cm on any one side, made from pure wool/wool blend of any ply. Exhibitor to attach label from wool used or receipt from the woollen mill– VAS Ltd

### **Over 70's**

6. Needlework - counted cross stitch, tapestry, any hand embroidered article
7. Machine work - patchwork, clothing, machine embroidered article
8. Knitted article - wool, cotton, ribbon lace
9. Crocheted article - wool, cotton, ribbon, lace
10. Novelty article
